
We want to welcome our new Auxiliary members **Liliana Johnson and Sue Lauer**. A special Thank You to Lilliana for helping with the poppy drive as well.

Vet Center Operations are a GO! for Central WA

Thanks to the hard work by our Douglas County Veteran Service Officer, an agreement has been reached between the Douglas County Board of Directors and the Yakima Valley Vet Center to create a Community Access Point here in the Wenatchee Valley. In the past our only access to this resource was when the Mobile Vet Center came to town during a Stand Down.



Douglas and Chelan County veterans now have another resource for **Behavioral Health Care** through the Federal VA Vet Center Program. A Vet Center offers **counseling services** to eligible veterans (including National Guard and Reserves) and their families to help support a whole-person approach to the VA's duty to care for Veterans.

Memorial Day

This year's Memorial Day ceremonies around the valley were carried off flawlessly by volunteers from 9 different organizations at 4 different locations throughout the day. This year, we started at Evergreen Memorial Park at 9am with the presentation of colors, wreath laying in honor of all who served and sacrificed in service to our country, taps and a rifle volley from the Honor Guard. East Wenatchee Mayor Jerrilea Crawford was the guest speaker for this event.

At 10am, a smaller event took place mid-span of the Old Wenatchee Black Bridge. This ceremony was to honor all those that served and were lost at sea. A ceremonial wreath was tossed into the Columbia River by Mayors Mike Poirier and Jerrilea Crawford.

At I I am, the exact ceremony that took place at Evergreen Pedestrian Bridge while the AFJROTC was repeated at the Wenatchee Cemetery with Wenatchee Mayor Mike Poirier as the guest speaker.

Post Cleanup and Spring Planting



This year's annual property cleanup and flower planting took place on May 21 with plenty of volunteers to handle the weeds, flower pots, and garbage pickup around the Post. Thank you Auxiliary and your green thumbs for all the plantings along the front of the building and in the pots down by the flag poles.

Spring Changing of the Pangborn Flag

On June 8, our post "Keepers of Flag Team" replaced the large 20'x30' flag at the Pangborn roundabout. For a replacement operation of this size, it requires a team of 8 people to safely lower and secure the old flag in calm conditions. That's the easy part. Without a winch system to hoist the flag, it takes up to 4 people pulling on the halyards to lift the heavy flag, the other 4 guide the flag as it unfolds and help attach the header grommets to the clips. In windy conditions, a couple more people are required. If it's blowing over 15 mph, or raining, we wait until conditions are more favorable. With the flag's large surface area, a gust of wind can easily lift a person off the ground on a wild ride that wouldn't end well. On this occasion with only a slight wind, the team was able to swap out the flags in about 20 minutes. Thanks Steve J., Dave, Parrish, Tony, Ed, Ken, and Kim for taking pictures.

East Wenatchee Police Dept Flagpole Dedication

Earlier this year, the East Wenatchee Police Department (EWPD) moved to its new location at the corner of Simon St and Rock Island Rd in East Wenatchee. One thing that was missing at their new facility was a flagpole. In a project started by the East Wenatchee Rotary, in conjunction with the American Legion Post 10 and Wenatchee Valley VFW, funds were donated by these three community partners to purchase a new flagpole for the station.

On June 14th (Flag Day), the flagpole was dedicated in a ceremony that saw the US Flag transferred from a joint -veteran color guard made up of Legion and VFW members to a police color guard detail that received the new flag and raised it during the National Anthem sung by VFW Chaplain Sarah Simonson. Attendees included East Wenatchee Mayor Jerrilea Crawford, Police Chief Rick Johnson, Assistant Chief Erik Hampton, police officers, East Wenatchee Rotary members, and members of the VFW and American Legion.

The ceremony concluded with a reception and tour of the new police station.
