Happy New Year's greetings to all!

2019 was an exceptional year for our VFW highlighted by two huge community projects to help veterans and their families. These wouldn't have happened without the financial support and project volunteers from Team Depot of the Wenatchee Home Depot Store. Many thanks to store manager Richard Madariaga for his exuberant support of these veteran projects.

The holiday season was busy as usual with several events and projects to bring thanks and good cheer to the Valley. We teamed up with 8th District Legislator Dr. Kim Schrier to present congressional pins to Vietnam veterans at a ceremony on November 9th. The Vietnam War Veteran pins were authorized by an act Congress and available to all veterans that served in the Vietnam Era, November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975. Direct service in Vietnam is not required to receive the pin as many veterans served around the world to support the effort in Southeast Asia. If you didn't receive a pin yet, contact the post and we'll add your name to the list for the next presentation ceremony later this year.

Our adopted unit, the 53d Explosive Ordnance Disposal Company at Yakima Firing Center, is still in Afghanistan as part of a 6-month deployment. We're planning a road trip to welcome them home in about 5 weeks. Not forgetting their families in Yakima, we sponsored the catering for their Christmas Party and provided \$20 gift cards from Target to all of the children.


100 YEARS

Disabled Veterans Can Access Commissaries and Exchanges Starting Jan. 1, 2020

Disabled veterans (0%-90%) will now have access to Commissaries, Military Service Exchanges, and Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) facilities starting January 1, 2020. Veterans who received a Purple Heart, were former POWs, **or veterans with a service-connected disability rating** will be able to physically access on-base facilities that were previously off limits. Veterans seeking access to military installations can use their current VA-issued **Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC)** to access base facilities. If a veteran is ineligible for a VHIC, DOD will temporarily accept the VA Health Eligibility Center Form H623A that indicates Priority Group 8E and an acceptable identification credential, like a REAL-ID-compliant driver's license or a U.S. passport.

Also, individuals **approved and designated** as the primary family caregivers of eligible veterans under the Department of Veterans Affairs Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers will have access to military facilities.
