Commander's Letter

As the weather gets cooler and we approach Fall in a couple weeks, I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable summer. Enjoyable as possible given our extreme heat and a worsening pandemic. But honestly, I hope you did have some fun these last few months.

In consulting with the Chelan Douglas Health District a few weeks ago, their Public Health Advisory recommendation was to halt all in-person gatherings and shared meals (donuts on Fridays and potluck dinners) while we're experiencing this surge in the Delta variant of COVID. Three weeks ago we had several close calls with VFW & Auxiliary members being notified they were exposed to either family members or friends that had active cases of COVID-19. Fortunately, everyone got tested, quarantined, and none of them came down with the virus. But this episode showed us that the lag time between exposure and testing confirmation could be as long as a couple weeks. More than ample time to become infected and unknowingly spread the virus to others.

The 3rd week of August I shut down the post until we confirmed everyone involved had tested negative and went through a 10-day quarantine. Additionally, at about the same time, the governor put the entire state back into mandatory masking indoors. This means we have to go back to virtual coffee breaks and having our in-person monthly meetings without potluck dinners. I apologize for having to do this, but we don't have any other options. Currently, Chelan & Douglas counties have one of the highest infection rates in the state, twice that of King County! Please get vaccinated, wear a mask, and stay away from the crowds. We as a community have to pull together to get through this, otherwise we've got a long Fall, Winter and Spring ahead of us. Enough soapbox...

SPRIT OF AMERICA MEMORIAL Please join us on September 11th at 11am at Cashmere Riverside Park, 201 Riverside Drive in Cashmere, for the annual remembrance ceremony. The Memorial is dedicated to all those who perished on September 11, 2001. It provides a tribute, honoring the victims and those who risked their lives during the 9/11 tragedy. Guest speakers this year will be **David and Peggy Beamer, parents of Todd Beamer who was lost on United Flight 93 when it crashed in Pennsylvania.**

when the scholarship prizes and award certificates were presented to Post Commanders to bring home. In July, Rachel and family were invited to Friday Coffee for a surprise presentation of her Dist. 7 and Department of Washington scholarship awards and certificates. She was also presented a custom made pen donated by Comrade Gary Rose for her future essay endeavors. AUTUMN LEAF FESTIVAL PARADE The VFW Department of Washington Color Guard will lead the opening ceremonies with the presentation of colors at the 58th Leavenworth Autumn Leaf Parade held on September 25th starting at 12 noon. In attendance this year will be the National VFW Auxiliary President Jean Hamil from Orlando, FL, VFW Department of Washington Commander Chad Hassebroek, and Department Auxiliary President Barbara Moore.

<u>WENATCHEE VETERANS STAND DOWN</u> The annual Veterans Stand Down will be held **September 18th** 8am— 3pm at the National Guard Armory on 5th Street in Wenatchee. In addition to the VA being there, several nonprofit veteran organizations will be there to help with housing and job assistance. Bring your veteran ID or DD-214 to enter.

FLAG DETAIL TEAM In addition to the normal Honor Guard and Color Guard details throughout the year, we also maintain several permanent flag locations in East Wenatchee. Every time we get a Presidential or Governor's proclamation to lower the flags to half-staff, it takes a team of 8-10 dedicated members to accomplish this in a timely manner. Sites we maintain are the Douglas County Law & Justice Center on 19th Street with 7 flags; the large 20x30 flag at Pangborn Airport (which can take up to 5 people); and the two flagpoles located at the Post. At times, all members are not available, usually due to the short notice nature of proclamations. Most details are carried out in the early morning before 9am, or after 6pm in the evening. If you would like to help us out with these details, please contact me or Jr Vice Commander Steve Johnson to add your name to the list.

IN CLOSING We have a lot on our plate in these next few months, but in our current conditions, we have to stay vigilant to short-notice changes or cancelations. We will try our best to communicate quickly any changes to our plans. Please stay informed on our local news and check our website (<u>https://vfwpost3617.org</u>) or Facebook page (<u>https://facebook.com/vfwpost3617</u>) prior to planned events to ensure they haven't been canceled by higher authority.


